Overview

A framework for building data literacy within legal and contract management functions — contract portfolio pattern analysis, risk clustering identification, and appropriately skeptical reading of aggregated compliance metrics — addressing the specific opportunity for legal functions to use portfolio-level data analysis to identify risk patterns individual contract review alone would miss.
