Overview

A framework for building data literacy for data catalog and metadata management users — metadata interpretation, dataset trust and freshness assessment, and effective catalog search strategy — addressing the gap between having a data catalog deployed and users genuinely being able to find and trust the right data within it.

If an organization has invested in a data catalog, doesn't that

solve the data discoverability problem automatically? Deploying a catalog is necessary infrastructure, but users still need literacy to interpret metadata correctly, assess dataset freshness and trustworthiness, and search effectively — without this literacy, a catalog can go underused even when it's technically available and well-populated.

What's the most common data literacy gap specifically among data

catalog users? Not checking dataset freshness or last-updated metadata before using a dataset, leading to decisions based on stale data that appeared current in search results but hadn't actually been refreshed recently.
