Overview

A framework for building foundational data literacy specifically for students and early-career professionals — critical consumption habits, basic statistical intuition, and workplace-relevant data communication skills — designed to accelerate the data judgment that many professionals otherwise develop slowly through years of on-the-job trial and error.

Don't most students already receive substantial data and

statistics education in school? Formal education often covers statistical techniques, but practical workplace data literacy — critically reading a business dashboard, communicating data-driven findings persuasively, recognizing common business data pitfalls — is a related but distinct and less commonly taught skill set.

Why focus specifically on early-career professionals rather than

general workforce data literacy? Building these habits early, before less rigorous data practices become ingrained through years of workplace experience, produces more durable literacy than trying to retrain established habits later — early intervention has outsized long-term value.

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
